

Happy with all those changes. Have added in on more comment, tracked on the attached. I've accepted all the other changes so this is a clean version.

I did, however, make several other suggestions in my covering email and they don't appear to have been picked up. As below:

We need to be clear on savings because in previous reports you have said that the capacity generated from going alternate black would supplement kerbside. Is that still your and view? We've incorporated cardboard without any uplift in resource because we got new vehicles. Are we still sure that if we go alternate black, with green on the alternate week for 9 months of the year we will have sufficient spare capacity to deal with any increase at the kerbside? Or will the larger vehicles take care of that? If the latter then we may need to spell that out in this report because it differs from what we have said previously. If I'm honest it's all a bit of an unknown, hence why I'm recommending an additional kerbside for the first 3 months, to see how we are doing. I've updated the projected savings table and hopefully I've focussed peoples mind towards the 'feasible' quantities and associated costs/

savings, but this may not go the way we anticipate, I'm loath to make any further assumptions than what I've already given, particularly as we haven't done a bin composition audit for a few years and there's no question that peoples habits have changed, particularly over the last 18 months. We are looking to do another audit in the spring 2022, so we can update projections afterwards, but I expect we will have committed ourselves by then. Also note that the savings table is purely based on gate fee diversion, it does not make allowance for recycling income because of market volatility. N.B. It's worth speaking to Sean about his conversation with the Chair regarding savings or not as the case may be!

Do you want to say anything about a communication campaign again, I think it would be worth it. I thought I'd covered that adequately with the following sentence: - "It was concluded that Hartlepool Borough Council's situation was most similar to Douglas' both in terms of their starting position and the approach they ultimately followed. Hartlepool's strategy was particularly noted for its communication strategy to householders, which incorporated the following tools:

- Initial leaflet drop advising of the change including the introduction of a new services i.e. green waste collection
- Second leaflet drop, giving specific details of how the changes would affect individual residents
- In a parallel process, door to door canvassing advising of the change and dealing with queries
- Community drop in sessions (surgeries) where officers spoke with groups/individuals in a relaxed environment.
- Issuing of new boxes, wheelie bins, collection calendars"

In your March 19 report, you also covered off other considerations around properties that do not currently have kerbside, those without gardens, flats and households with high levels of residual waste and Christmas. I think it's worth having a section in this latest report on those items again or maybe a set of FAQs as an appendix as it will allay concerns. Think of all the objections we're likely to get from residents and Members and put that in the FAQ with an answer. Again, I thought the paragraph below captured the essence of likely problem areas, but an FAQ would be a good idea: -

"The March 2019 report also considered properties, areas, periods and situations which may require more flexibility in the way we approach service provision. Examples given included:

- Access and spatial limitations e.g. The Drives by the Castle Mona
- Peak household waste producing periods e.g. Christmas holidays
- Large households

It is considered that a combination of solutions which could include the issuing of larger bins, additional collections or exercising some degree of side waste leniency at Christmas for example, would alleviate these issues (source: WRAP 2007)"

We seem to have dropped any suggestion that we collect textiles at the kerbside. Could we with the new kerbside vehicles? Either way we need to say what we think we should do with textiles as it just seems to have dropped off the radar and if we encourage Members to read the old reports, they'll pick up on it. I've not dropped it per se, it's just that I have no supporting data regarding quantities, so have nothing to really evaluate, I've just assumed it's a given that we'll take it. Unlike other materials there are multiple disposal routes for textiles including charity shops/charity bins so whilst I firmly believe we should and can offer a collection for this material, I don't feel it will have any significant bearing on savings/ capacity to warrant any deeper analysis, clearly we'll need to do due diligence on where we can dispose of it for an income.



I have been reading the census, it's one of those things I like to do, don't judge me. I'm trying to get my facts straight ahead of any possible introduction of alternate weekly collections.

As I understand the proposal every household will have 1 x 240L residual, 3 x 55L recycling and a seasonal garden waste collection every fortnight. This is a capacity of 405L per fortnight per household plus garden waste.

The census tells me that in 2016 there were 710 households in Douglas with more than 4 occupants, this means that 93.9% had 4 or less occupants. At 4 occupants this would equate to 51L per person per week in waste capacity.

Can you please confirm that this aligns with a recognised standard for waste collection.

I am supportive of the changes (and voted in favour twice in the past), I'm just reassuring myself.

The alternative composting facility in St Johns has a lower gate fee (£38 p/t as opposed to £40 p/t) but in terms of lost operational time and increased fuel costs we do not consider this to be more economically advantageous. Green gate fee charge – The Contractor reported to the last meeting of the Civic Amenity Site Committee, that the Council, as Contractor, had received notice from Middle Park Recycling (MPR) of their intent to increase the gate fee for green waste from the current charge of £19.00 per tonne to £40.00 per tonne with effect from the 1<sup>st</sup> October 2021. The Contractor wrote to MPR explaining the budgetary implications for the partnering Local Authorities and requested that the terms of the charge imposition be reconsidered. MPR have subsequently written back offering to stage the increase over two equal increments as follows: -

- Current gate fee £19.00
- 1<sup>st</sup> December 2021 £30.00
- 1st March 2022 £40.00

The cost implication of the new charge is based on 2019/20 tonnages, as this was the last full year unaffected by COVID lockdowns: -

The ECAS contractor has contacted an alternative composting facility situated at Ballanevin, St John's who have advised that their gate fee is £38 per tonne, with potential for a further discount subject to tonnage. However, the additional fuel cost would not offset unless the gate fee even if it were £35.00 per tonne. In addition the Skip contractor is contractually obligated to move a certain amount of skips in a given period, which effectively amounts to 3.5 days per week, with an increased journey time of 1 hour per load, this may give rise to a claim for increased cost from the skip contractor.

SUBJECT	Kerbside Cardboard collection
REASON FOR BRIEFING NOTE	To advise members of progress following the introduction of cardboard to the kerbside collection service
BRIEFING NOTE	At a special meeting of the Executive Committee on 16th January 2020, Members resolved to support the following recommendation: "The introduction of a household cardboard collection service, on the proviso that the new vehicle replacement report is approved regarding new recycling collection vehicles".
	In a parallel process, the Head of Fleet Services submitted the Vehicle & Plant Replacement Report to the Executive Committee on 29th November 2019, which included a recommendation, to replace two of the original kerbside collection vehicles with two new 'Romaquip' kerb-sort vehicles. The new multi-compartment recycling vehicles would enable cardboard to be collected at the kerbside. The resolution to purchase the vehicles was ratified at a special meeting of the Executive in January 2020.
	The new kerb-sort vehicles arrived with the Council in September 2020 and the new brown cardboard collection service was launched in November 2020 following a month long communications campaign.
	Data capture for cardboard in the first two months was combined with paper, this was due to the way in which Waste Services weighed and tipped the material, therefore the initial cardboard weights for those two months is an estimated reading only. In early January 2021 the Isle of Man Government imposed a circuit breaker lockdown, which resulted in the suspension of the kerbside service.
	The service resumed again in February 2021 but was shortlived as the Island went into a further lockdown, throughout March 2021. The service fully resumed in April 2021. Weights for February onwards are actual carboard tonnages, with almost 23 tonnes collected since the

service began, this represents a gate fee saving at the Energy from Waste Plant of more than £2,000.00, despite 2 months of inactivity. The table below gives the monthly tonnages over the first 12 months, with a year high of 4 tonnes in September.

Setting aside the initial start up and the periods disrupted by lockdowns, the general trend is consistently over 2 tonnes per month, with a year high of 4 tonnes in September. There is no obvious explanation for this particular spike, with one suggestion being that it could be linked to the start of the new school term i.e. packaging associated with school uniforms/ bags etc, purchased on line.

As part of the review, we also investigated what, if any impact the new collection service was having on Civic Amenity site cardboard. The table below shows Civic Ameinty site cardboard tonnages for the past 3 years. As kerbside cardboard started in November 2020, we have used this as the base month for comparison purposes.

Overall, there is a clear downward trend in CA site cardboard, which has consistently dropped year on year, showing a 62 tonne drop between 2018/19 and 2019/20 (column C). Some of the drop in 2020 can be attributed to COVID lockdowns, but outside those periods the figures were also lower. Total tonnage for 2020/21 (column D), is 97 tonnes, this represents a reduction of 53% on the 2018/19 figure. Again some of this can be attributed to lockdowns in January and March 2021 as well as the introduction of kerbside service, but as the overall trend was also downward, it is difficult to ascertain how much of this reduction is due to channel shift, that is, people disposing of their cardboard through the kerbside service. It is accepted that the service is still in its infancy and collected tonnage are expected to grow over time.

Generally, the first year results have been satisfactory but clearly there is a lot more cardboard out there that could be captured and with the prospect of Alternate Weekly Collections commencing in the near future, promotion of the service will intensify as part of the communication campaign.







Tenders for bins



The problem, as I understand it, is that we have quotations (but not tenders) from three suppliers for provision of bins. I assume these quotations would be on the basis of cost per unit, i.e. 500 bins would cost £XX each. So from that we've calculated the cost for the number of bins we need.

But the total cost is well in excess of the limits in Standing Orders over which tenders must be invited. That hasn't been done but there is a rush to get orders placed as soon as possible.

Standing Order 129 requires anything over £56,000 to be tendered rather than quoted for. And it contains that paragraph stating that it is the whole cost of any scheme that must be considered, and not just different elements.

And Standing order 142 requires Committee approval to the acceptance of any tender over £21,000.

My view is that the only way to get on the right track is to invite tenders. With 14 days' notice required, that could be done in time to get the figures to the next Committee meeting on Monday 14th February (the report could be written beforehand omitting the figures, which could then be reported at the meeting). Just going to the Committee with quotations when tenders should have been obtained would only give the opportunity for opponents of the scheme to question the propriety of what's being done.

I haven't been able to talk to the bound about it but I've copied this to her and am sure if she doesn't concur she'll let us know.

I've looked at Standing Orders in relation to tenders.

The problem, as I understand it, is that we have quotations (but not tenders) from three suppliers for provision of bins. I assume these quotations would be on the basis of cost per unit, i.e. 500 bins would cost £XX each. So from that we've calculated the cost for the number of bins we need.

But the total cost is well in excess of the limits in Standing Orders over which tenders must be invited. That hasn't been done but there is a rush to get orders placed as soon as possible.

Standing Order 129 requires anything over £56,000 to be tendered rather than quoted for. And it contains that paragraph stating that it is the whole cost of any scheme that must be considered, and not just different elements.

And Standing order 142 requires Committee approval to the acceptance of any tender over £21,000.

My view is that the only way to get on the right track is to invite tenders. With 14 days' notice required, that could be done in time to get the figures to the next Committee meeting on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> February (the report could be written beforehand omitting the figures, which could then be reported at the meeting). Just going to the Committee with quotations when tenders should have been obtained would only give the opportunity for opponents of the scheme to question the propriety of what's being done.

I haven't been able to talk to the Chief about it but I've copied this to her and am sure if she doesn't concur she'll let us know.

Policy on Purchase of Additional Wheeled Bins - Fees and Charges

# A14. Policy on Purchase of Additional Wheeled Bins - Fees and Charges

The Committee considered a written report by the Senior Engineering and Waste Services Manager seeking approval to suspend the current policy of allowing householders to purchase additional wheeled bins for residual waste; and to agree a policy of only collecting one residual bin per household unless exceptions had been made.

Following on from the decision to introduce alternate weekly refuse collections, it had become apparent that the current policy of allowing households to purchase additional wheeled bins was counter-productive to the aims of the service change initiative. The policy had been in place for many years, with the cost being included in the Fees and Charges section of the Council's Annual Estimates Book; and recently, a number of ratepayers had sought to purchase an additional bin in anticipation of the new service, being concerned that they would not have sufficient capacity to accommodate the change.

The fundamental basis of the service change was to increase the recycling rate and to reduce household waste. This objective would be achieved by reducing the weekly capacity for rubbish, whilst increasing the capacity for recycling. Under the current policy, however, the second bin would place pressure on the held-stock of bins for new customers and would negate householders need to recycle.

There was no legal basis to compel households to recycle, however, in order to achieve the aim of increasing the recycling rate, it was proposed that the Council should introduce and enforce a policy of collecting only one residual waste bin from a household at any time. Exceptions would be made for special circumstances and, if it was determined that the household required more capacity, a second bin would be issued (not sold) to the household.

It was therefore recommended that the policy of selling second bins to households be suspended with immediate effect and, once the change in service provision commenced, that a policy of collecting only one residual waste bin per household per collection week be enforced, with any variation to this being subject to an assessment. Assessments would comprise an inspection / visit to the property and discussion with the householder in order to gather details such as occupancy, any unusual waste items, or other special circumstances. Where additional capacity was agreed, a re-assessment would be undertaken within a determined period, e.g., eighteen months.

Resolved, "(i) That particulars of the report be noted on the minutes;

- (ii) That the policy of selling second bins to households be suspended with immediate effect;
- (iii) That the section relating to Fees and Charges in the Council's Annual Estimates be amended accordingly; and
- (iv) That once the service change was implemented, a new policy of collecting only one standard 240-litre bin per household on collection day be introduced and enforced, subject to any variation as a result of an assessment."

Currently the Council collects approximately 600 tonnes of recyclable material per annum, which would otherwise be collected as part of the household residual waste (or Government bring bank scheme). According to our modelling (based on several Waste audits conducted over the past 14 years) we believe overall tonnage capture after introducing fortnightly refiuse collections, could be closer to 1,800 tonnes per annum, with more than 50% having zero calorific value, this would represent approx 600kg net change in incinerable material diversion.

In terms of cost/ benefit for the EFW, that would be a matter for the Department of Infrastructure and Suez. One way of meeting any material shortfall would be to permit other jurisdictions to export RDF (refuse derived fuel) to the Island i.e. pay the IOM to dispose of their waste as opposed to others, albeit I believe this strategy has been rejected previously. Again from my involvement with the waste working groups circa 2016, there was a recognition that certain sectors on the Island were burying waste or having unregulated waste fires, although it was acknowledged at the time that the Government didn't have the resources to police this.

I trust this is of assistance and as part of the rollout of the new service, we will shortly be launching a campaign to Douglas residents which will hopefully help to alleviate the vast majority of concerns, my team are also available to attend political surgeries if you require.



I already have a few questions.

1. 2% of waste is shown as Tetra, but I'm not aware of us offering that service, the creamery will collect their cartons, but what about the rest? Are we planning to collect cartons or reintroduce bring banks at the CA site? Currently there is no plan to collect tetrapak as part of kerbside service, because we don't have sufficient compartments on the vehicles and currently don't have the room to separate on a picking line. At this moment, the creamery do not intend to put a bin at the CA site, but have said they will continually review this decision. The creamery use Recyclecollect under 2 scenarios, (1) where they are classed as a creamery customer, they pay recyclecollect or (2) they are recyclecollect customers and recyclecollect pay a small gate fee to dispose of the material. Tel's process all of the material on behalf of the Creamery.

- 2. 5% of waste is shown as construction, approximately what is the split between inert and burnable. Please don't waste time researching that, just a gut feeling will do. This was a bit of an anomaly, apparently one of the bins collected had a fire surround in their wheelie bin (concrete and tiles), which obviously weighed a lot, is non-conforming waste and distorted the figures, in real terms there was very little construction waste.
- 3. The plastics section says 1, 2 and 5, however, I was always of the understanding that we acceptable PET and HDPE bottles, do we now accept, or are we planning to accept, type 5? Yes, we are now accepting type 5 and will be promoting this more as part of the campaign, it already is heavily featured in our recycling educational programme.
- 4. I notice green waste has gone down from 9% to 4%, is that due to the time of year? This does raise the question about the need for a green waste service. This is almost certainly due to the time of year when the audit was conducted and will obviously form part of the briefing note analysis as a qualification.
- 5. Textiles accounted for 3% at the last audit and now they are not shown even though I understood that we were going to collect clothes as part of the changes. We will be introducing textiles in the future, this will require a procurement process to select the disposal route and we are also conscious that there may be an impact on other charities, so this won't be a major push item as part of the AWC campaign.
- 6. The pie charts (and I love a good pie chart) only show percentages. It would be good to have an absolute number for the total weight of waste deposited at the EFW in 2017 and 2022. I would like to know the general trend, are people producing more waste? the more detailed information you require will be provided in the briefing note

Primarily the audit will tell us, that of the 40+ houses where we took their bin, if they are (1) recycling at all (2) recycling all they can (3) have capacity to go fortnightly based on their current arrangements. This information will form an important part of our communication campaign but as a means of determining whether people are recycling more today than they were at the last audit, I don't think we can totally rely on the findings because the sample size is too small and behaviours will have changed a fair bit since 2017.

The best performance gauge remains actual tonnages collected (below) and the recycling rate. Both of these are collated on a monthly basis and reported through the members bulletin. You will note that February was down on January, which is a typical post-Christmas spike. 






Morning —

I've attached the charts from both the 2017 audit and our most recent audit below. I'm current Analysing the results in a bit more detail, but in essence the amount of recyclable material in the bins by weight, relative to residual waste is down, suggesting more is being recycled than previously, which is obviously positive. There will be a number of qualifications so I'll be producing a briefing note for members.





As I said in my reply to MHK, assuming our modelling is representative and applying the 'feasible' capture rate, I would anticipate an additional 600 tonne of recyclable material (paper, plastics and cardboard) to be diverted from the EFW which based on current EFW tonnages is approximately 1.4%. This will not have any significant effect on their operation and as you suggest, they will stockpile until they have sufficient material.

NOTE: I've just noticed in my response to , where I say "could be closer to 1,800 tonnes per annum, with more than 50% having zero calorific value, this would represent approx 600kg net change in incinerable material diversion." The 600kg should be tonnes.


Hello, I had a discreet chat with a Suez employee who didn't think a reduction would be a problem for them.

I'm currently drafting a report to Exec Cttee regarding a policy for missed collections after we go fortnightly (by missed collections, I mean occasions where the householder failed to put their bin out for collection, not where the refuse crew has accidentally missed it). As part of section 5, 'Alternatives considered by not recommended' — we identified the potential of levying a charge on the household if they wanted us to go back and collect.. currently we don't return (except in extenuating circumstances) but they only have a week to wait until the next collection. Obviously this will be more difficult for households to manage when we go to fortnightly's. Dana has asked whether levying a charge (separate to the rate) is permitted under the Act. I'm not 100% sure whether s.65(5) of the PHA would apply here, as these are exceptions to our statutory duty to collect. Could you please take a look to see if this provisions allows us to levy a charge under the circumstances described above? the relevant bits from the Act: -

S. 65 (5) A local authority or the Department of Infrastructure shall make such reasonable charges as it may determine in respect of the collection under subsection (1) or (3) of commercial waste, and may make such reasonable charges as it may determine in respect of the collection under subsection (1) or (3) of household waste.

65 Collection of waste

- (1) A local authority shall make arrangements for the collection of household waste and commercial waste from premises within its district, except waste of the following descriptions —
- (a) waste which is at a place which is so isolated or inaccessible that the cost of collecting it would be unreasonably high;
- (b) waste, adequate arrangements for the disposal of which have been or can reasonably be expected to be made by a person who controls the waste;

Obviously the householder already pays for a collection through their rates, but to return because they failed to put their bin out on time, is an additional cost to that which is rated for.



Service Change in Refuse and Recycling Collections – Missed Bin Policy



Herewith minute from the Executive Committee Meeting held on Thursday 26th May 2022 (please note the change in the length of time for the amnesty period, from the proposed one month to two months):

#### C23. Service Change in Refuse and Recycling Collections – Missed Bin Policy

The Committee considered a written report by the Senior Engineering and Waste Services Manager in relation to a proposed policy for dealing with missed bins, once the refuse service moved to fortnightly collections.

The current, unwritten, policy regarding missed bins was that, unless there was evidence that the bin had been set out for collection at the correct time and location, then it was assumed that the bin had not been made available for collection and the householder was advised that the Council would return the following week as part of the weekly refuse service.

While in practice a common sense approach was followed, it was also normal for a check to be undertaken of the bin-chip to determine if there was any data for that day; and for a check of the on-board cameras to be made to establish if the bin had been in situ when the vehicle had passed the property.

With the introduction of fortnightly collections, it would be much more difficult for households which forgot to put their bin out to last a further fortnight until the next collection. As some early confusion was anticipated, it was proposed that an amnesty period be allowed, as householders adjusted to the new service. After that, unless there was clear evidence that the error was on the Council's part or there were extenuating circumstances, missed bins would not be returned to, to be emptied. Members suggested that the proposed one month period was not sufficient, and agreed that the amnesty period should instead be for two months.

Members noted the criteria that would be taken into account to constitute extenuating circumstances. If requests to return were one-offs, the Waste Team would likely return, however, if a pattern of repeat requests by a particular household emerged, it would be reiterated to householders that it was their responsibility to ensure their bin was presented at the appropriate time and place, and that the Waste Team would not be returning to the property. Advice would also be given on how to minimise waste until the next scheduled collection and on what materials could be disposed of at the civic amenity site.

Resolved, "(i) That particulars of the report be noted on the minutes; and

#### (ii) That it be recommended to Council:-

- That a policy of not returning to bins that were not presented for collection at the right time in the correct location be enforced, unless the reason was due to extenuating circumstances or Council error; and
- That an amnesty period of two months be agreed immediately following the introduction of the new service, whereby the Council returned to all missed bins and thus allowing householders to adjust to the new arrangements."

# C22. Service Change in Refuse and Recycling Collections – Non-Conforming Garden Waste Policy

The Committee considered a written report by the Senior Engineering and Waste Services Manager in relation to a proposed policy for dealing with non-conforming waste in the Garden Waste Collection Service.

As part of the planned introduction of fortnightly refuse collections, it had been agreed to introduce a simultaneous garden waste collection service. The planned commencement of the service was August 2022 and, currently, 4,200 wheeled bins were on order, which, once received would be available on request to households with eligible gardens across the Borough.

Initial discussion had taken place with a licensed composting facility operator in order to establish their policy regarding non-conforming material. In essence, there would be a gate fee for disposing of the material but, for non-conforming loads, a further penalty charge may be levied and the aim was therefore to prevent any non-conforming waste at source.


The proposed policy for dealing with non-conforming waste in the Garden Waste Collection Service sought to avoid the garden waste bin from being used for general rubbish and / or non-conforming waste – that was, items that were not permissible under the composting company's licence (e.g., food waste, invasive plant species, and anything non-organic). It was therefore imperative that householders should receive comprehensive advice and information of what was and was not acceptable waste for composting.

It was noted that households that deliberately placed non-conforming waste in their garden waste bins would receive a warning notice; and failure to adhere to the notice may result in the garden waste bin being removed and the service being withdrawn under a 'three strikes' rule. Where the service had been withdrawn, households would, however, have the right of appeal.

Resolved, "(i) That particulars of the report be noted on the minutes; and

(ii) That it be recommended to Council that the following policy for dealing with non-conforming waste in the Garden Waste Collection Service be adopted:-

- Wheeled bins to be left unemptied where nonconforming waste was observed;
- Households to receive a warning notice to the effect that the bin had not been collected because it contained nonconforming waste; and
- If a household received three warning notices, the bin would be removed and the service withdrawn, but in the event of the service being withdrawn, the householder to have a right of appeal."
