

- We need a different heading to AWC. Fortnightly refuse (or rubbish) collections. Fortnightly refuse collections.
- 2. Why are we separating brown cardboard out? This is an ideal rather than a policy... and would be pushed as giving household an extra bag. The reason for this is, we have received a notice from UPM that we are close to exceeding the acceptable contamination level for cardboard mixed in our paper. Ok, we need to push this as you've suggested because we don't have cttee agreement to this.
- 3. I know we said we wanted to keep collection days the same but what are the chances of having each household's collection day being the same day, so black/kerbside one week and green the next but on the same day? How doable is that? I think it is an aspiration and in most cases achievable, but there will be some exceptions. OK
- 4. Agree to a recycling fact along what you have suggested but I would drop the target bit. We'll be accused of making changes to hit targets and that is not what this is about. And use the world 'only' ahead of 6%, which is way behind most other jurisdictions. Okay, we could put in a stat saying "the current recycling rate in the Borough is only 6%, after our recent audit (Mar22) over 23% of the material found in the bins collected from sample households was recyclable, despite those households receiving the kerbside service". Perfect.
- 5. The original plan was to have the leaflet drop first and then seek nominations you may inundated with calls about the new service never mind from those asking about garden bins but if you'd rather include here, we can do that. Think about what will work for you best. Fair question, that was my understanding but we do need to invite bin requests asap, so maybe accept the pain now! Whilst we have Scott he will be able to take the hit out of the calls, I think we have to start getting the requests in to enable delivery of the bins. Go for it then.
- 6. Once we get the final proof back, might be worth sense checking it on someone not involved see what they say about the leaflet and whether they have any further questions. I will also need to send to Members, who can have a keen eye. Good idea. Cool.

A few days ago the Douglas North political surgery was held. One constituent asked a question about the new scheme that I thought you might know the answer to. If you would be so kind as to let me know your reflection on the matter, I am going to include it my answer to the constituent per email.

He wanted to know how the households are going to identify their garden waste bins, I.e. are they going to be labelled with a sticker or paint? He said that while our waste services have the electronic chips for identification, households still want to be able to mark their own bin, especially in closely built up areas.

His main concern was that if households have to mark their own bins with oil paint, a lot of paint & turpentine would end up in rainwater gulleys as many people wrongfully clean their brushes.


A few days ago the Douglas North political surgery was held. One constituent asked a question about the new scheme that I thought you might know the answer to. If you would be so kind as to let me know your reflection on the matter, I am going to include it my answer to the constituent per email.

He wanted to know how the households are going to identify their garden waste bins, I.e. are they going to be labelled with a sticker or paint? He said that while our waste services have the electronic chips for identification, households still want to be able to mark their own bin, especially in closely built up areas.

His main concern was that if households have to mark their own bins with oil paint, a lot of paint & turpentine would end up in rainwater gulleys as many people wrongfully clean their brushes.

He elaborated further that identification by postcode & house number would be enough rather than street name & house number. He said that in 1992, when the majority of the black bins were purchased, post codes did not exist as they were only introduced the following year.



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
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

APPENDIX A

ALTERNATIVE WEEKLY REFUSE/ RECYCLING/ GARDEN WASTE COLLECTIONS

FAQ's

- 1. When will fortnightly collections start? The aim is to start a garden waste collection service around August time and once bedded in, household rubbish collections will move to fortnightly collections.
- 2. What if I do not have enough space in my bin for my non-recyclable rubbish? Waste officers will carry out an assessment of your situation, providing advice on waste minimisation techniques.
- 3. What day of the week will my household rubbish be collected? Ideally we will look to maintain existing collection days for both recycling and refuse.
- 4. What items can I recycle? You will be able to recycle plastic and glass bottles, paper, white and grey card, brown cardboard, aluminium and steel cans, textiles and garden waste.
- How will my garden waste be collected? Eligible households will be able to apply for a
 further 240 litre wheelie bin for their garden waste. Applications can be made by calling
 Waste Services on 696445 or by e-mail: refuse@douglas.gov.im
- 6. How do I know if I'm eligible for a garden waste bin? If you currently generate the equivalent of one black bin bag (or more) of garden waste per week, during the growing season, you will be eligible to apply for a garden waste bin.
- 7. Do I have to have another wheelie bin? Our method of collection for green waste will be the same as for household rubbish so ideally this needs to be placed in its own dedicated bin. If households do not have room for a garden waste bin, bagged garden waste will be accepted subject to assessment.
- 8. When will my garden waste be collected? This will also be carried out fortnightly with specific collection dates to be determined in due course. The service will run between February and October each year. Note: The Eastern Civic Amenity Site will continue to provide skips for garden waste if you prefer that option.
- 9. What can I put in my garden waste bin? You can put the following items in your garden waste bin:
 - Grass cuttings
 - Hedge cuttings
 - Leaves, bark and tree pruning's
 - Twigs and small branches up to 5cm (2") across.
 - Bedding from herbivore pets e.g. rabbits, guinea pigs
 - Cut flowers

Plants and weeds

- 10. Can I put any food waste in my garden waste bin e.g. fruit, vegetables, eggshells? The UK's Animal By-Product Regulations do not allow fruit and vegetable (peelings) to be placed in a garden waste bin. However, fallen fruit or vegetables directly from the garden are permitted. In addition you should not place invasive non-native species in your recycling bin such as Japanese Knotweed. Schedule 8 of the Wildlife Act 1990 includes a list of invasive non-native species.
- 11. Will I be able to get more kerbside boxes for my recyclables? Yes, more kerbside boxes/ bags can be obtained free of charge by calling 696445 or e-mail: refuse@douglas.gov.im
- 12. What will happen if I do not have enough room in my bin? The Council's policy has always been lids fully down and no side waste. If you do put out side waste, your bin will be emptied as normal and your side waste will be put back in the empty bin, reducing your capacity for the next two weeks, this is why it is important you recycle as much as you possibly can. Please call Waste Services on 696445 if you require an assessment.
- 13. How do I dispose of my textiles i.e. clothes, shoes, fabrics? Textiles should be placed in a bag (not box) and tied off. This service will be available from 2023.
- 14. Will there be any special arrangements around Christmas for extra rubbish? The Council already provides an additional service for Christmas Trees, however some flexibility for side waste may be exercised following Christmas where many households will struggle with capacity in their bins.
- 15. I currently receive a 'red lid' assisted collection for my household rubbish; will this be the same for my garden waste bin? Yes, all households who currently receive an assisted collection will be entitled to apply for assisted collection for their garden waste bin.
- 16. I don't currently receive a kerbside recycling collection, what arrangements will be made? We will assess your particular situation and ensure you have access to recycling within your immediate vicinity, which may include provision of communal recycling banks.
- 17. Is there an increases risk of attracting vermin with fortnightly collections? Provided that putrescible items (food waste) are bagged and placed in the bin, the risk is minimal.
- 18. Is there a risk of an increase in fly tipping in my area? According to data from the UK, after the introduction of fortnightly refuse collections, there is often an initial spike in fly tipping, the Council's waste officers and wardens are preparing for this. However, prior to implementation the Council will provide advice on how best to minimise household waste and therefore help to reduce the likelihood of incidences of fly tipping.
- 19. How should I dispose of nappies and other sanitary waste items? It is recommended that nappies etc. are double bagged before placing in your household rubbish bin.

APPENDIX A

20. Will there be any food waste collection? There is no current alternative disposal route for food waste. However, the Council will continually look at emerging opportunities for a food waste collection service.
